MINUTES: JULY 11, 2017 REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING

Mr. Farley moved to approve the July 11, 2017 Regular Town Board Meeting minutes as presented.

Seconded by Mr. Platt.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Mr. Dumian read the following letter from the Conklin Senior Citizens Club into the minutes:

"Conklin Senior Citizens Club appreciates the generous support from the Town of Conklin Town Board to support the bus trips for the seniors who are on fixed incomes. Conklin Senior Citizens Club are planning a bus trip this fall and we are requesting \$1,000.00 to offset the cost of the bus. Mr. Francisco stated that monies for a trip to Pennsylvania and to the St. Lawrence River area were already included in the 2017 Budget, noting that \$1,000 is the Town's annual contribution to the Seniors.

Mr. Dumian also acknowledged receipt of an invitation from the Town of Kirkwood to attend the official dedication of the Geiger Lane Boat Launch on August 15, 2017, at 6:00 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

None.

REPORT: SUPERVISOR'S REPORT - On file in Town Clerk's office

OLD BUSINESS:

DISCUSSION REGARDING CHICKENS

Mr. Dumian stated that the Code Office has received some new formal complaints about chickens running loose in residential areas and is following up on the complaints. He stated that the Board needs to discuss potential revisions to the Town Code regarding chickens and where they would be allowed in the Town, adding that non-Agricultural areas would need to have some restrictions. Mr. Boyle stated that chickens must be kept contained in all areas in the Town. Mr. Dumian added that no roosters would be allowed because of the noise. He added, "The final version of the law will be the law and it will be enforced."

Town Attorney Cheryl Sacco stated that she had drafted a proposed local law regarding chickens in 2016, noting that the draft law called for a limit of four hens, no roosters, no sale of eggs, and set requirements for lot size, size of coop (four square feet per hen), fencing, setback placement, cleanliness standards, etc. Mr. Dumian stated that lot size should be used as a determinant as to the number of hens allowed. Ms. Sacco stated that the proposed draft law creates an overlay district for areas zoned Agricultural and Residential (R12 and R15). She will send a draft to the Town Board for their consideration.

DISCUSSION REGARDING MS CONTRACTING MINING SITE/MONTROSE DRIVE

Mr. Dumian stated that the DEC (New York State Department of Environmental Conservation) allows "only five certain conditions upon which the Town of Conklin can comment," adding that the Town CANNOT deny a mining permit, even if it does not approve a Special Use Permit, as mining permits are issued by the DEC. He added that the DEC issued a permit to MS Contracting to mine for bluestone at the site on Montrose Drive and the mine is now in operation, with operating hours beginning at 6 A.M. Mr. Dumian commented that the Special Use Permit is misleading because it makes it seem that the Town has some authority over mining permits, when in actuality it does not have the authority to grant or deny mining permits.

Mr. Dumian read excerpts from the letter sent by the Town of Conklin to the DEC expressing the concerns of the Board and the residents, including a request to pave the first 100 feet of the driveway and to have a sweeper on site to address dust, a request to increase the required setback more than 25 feet, and bonding requirements to cover the cost of repairs to roads damaged by trucks hauling stone. He then read the DEC's response to the Town's letter. It essentially acknowledged the concerns presented but stated that they would be minimized and/or addressed.

Mr. Dumian stated that the Town addressed the residents' concerns but the DEC still issued the mining permit, reiterating that the Special Use Permit is not useful.

NEW BUSINESS:

DISCUSSION/MEGA VS. NYSEG DIRECT ENERGY SOURCE BILLING

The Town Board discussed handouts showing comparisons of cost for the last several years between MEGA (Municipal Energy and Gas Alliance) and NYSEG (New York State Electric and Gas Corporation) for the purchase of energy. Mr. Dumian stated that NYSEG provides a variable rate but is less expensive, while MEGA provides a fixed rate but at a higher cost. Mr. Francisco stated that the fixed rate includes possible extra costs to MEGA.

RESO 2017-146: AUTHORIZE TOWN SUPERVISOR/END CONSTELLATION ENERGY ELECTRIC SUPPLY AGREEMENT/END DATES OF 9-30-2017 & 10-15-2017

Mr. Boyle moved for the following resolution:

Be It Resolved: that the Town Board of the Town of Conklin authorizes the Town Supervisor, William Dumian, Jr., to end the Constellation Energy (MEGA) Electric Supply Agreement as of the end dates of September 30, 2017, and October 15, 2017, depending upon UDC account dates.

2018 BUDGET PROCESS

Mr. Dumian discussed the 2018 Budget timeline. Budget requests are due to the Budget Officer from department heads by August 18. On September 12, the Tentative Budget will be distributed and the Board will begin its review, with department heads being present at the September 26 Town Board meeting to answer any questions from the Board. Mr. Francisco stated that the Conklin Seniors Club is asking for \$1,500 for bus trips for 2018, noting that the cost of the bus trips has increased to \$750 per trip. He stated that the allocation to the Seniors has increased by \$250 per year until reaching the \$1,000 allotted in the 2017 Budget. Mr. Francisco noted that Conklin Seniors Club President Bob Tokos is resigning, effective December 2017.

RESO 2017-147: RESCIND RESO 2017-135 HIRING NICK PAPPAS/PART-TIME CODE OFFICER/NEW POSITION TITLE NEEDED

Mr. Francisco asked about a pedestrian crossing button and Mr. Dumian replied that New York State is addressing this request. Mrs. Dubay asked about the entrance to the new Dick's Warehouse Distribution Center, noting that a new left hand turn lane has been added. She commented that this area of Route 7 has been cleaned of the stones dropped by the stone trucks but the State does not clean the rest of Route 7. Mrs. Dubay also commented about the noise

from the trucks from their suspension and from the stones being dropped on the road. She added that in both 2006 and 2011, New York State promised to repave the area near Corbettsville.

Mr. John Dubay stated that in 2005, New York State promised that "Route 7 will be completely re-done." He added that he and Mrs. Dubay served on the Walkable Community Committee but added that "the 2006 flood killed the project."

CHICKENS

Mr. Richard Nemcek of 25 June Street stated that his neighbor's chickens are "all over his yard." He asked what is being done with the law regarding chickens, adding that his neighbor needs to install a higher fence to contain his chickens. Code Officer Nick Vascello stated that he has sent two letters to owners of chickens informing them that their chickens must be contained and issuing them a 30-Day Order to Remedy. He added that he sent the letters approximately fifteen days ago and there has been no compliance to date. Mr. Vascello stated that the process has been started and added that if there situation is not brought into compliance with the Order to Remedy, the owners of the chickens will be subject to court actions and fines.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WORK/CALABRISI ROAD & BOYLE BOULEVARD

Mr. Boyle, speaking as a private citizen rather than as a Town Board member, stated that when the Town Highway Department cleaned ditches on Calabrisi Road, the department dumped dirt on his property. He asked if the Town ever asks permission of the property owner before dumping dirt, adding that it was dumped against timber that he harvests. Highway Superintendent Brian Coddington stated that the dirt can be dumped in the Town's right-of-way, even if it is against the timber. He said to Mr. Boyle, "Ask me if you want dirt (on Mr. Boyle's Scofield Road property) and we'll bring it." Mr. Coddington stated that his crew has the authority to maintain the right-of-way. When Mr. Boyle addressed his concerns to the Board, Mr. Dumian stated that he should address his concerns to Mr. Coddington, who added, "I take care of that, not the Town Board." Discussion ensued regarding strengthening the shoulders of the road and where the dirt is dumped.

Mr. Arthur Boyle stated to Mr. Coddington that he "saw two Highway trucks dump dirt on private properties," but when he asked, he was told the Highway Department "couldn't dump on private land." Mr. Coddington stated that the load in question had contained millings, which he stated are a "cost item" and cannot be put on private property. Mr. Coddington stated that his crew had been taking sluice pipes out.

Mr. Arthur Boyle stated that his "name is on Boyle Boulevard and the Town is not maintaining it properly." Mr. Dumian stated that Mr. Coddington has a schedule for repair of roads in the Town. Mr. Coddington stated that Boyle Boulevard gets stone and oil "every five years," adding that it is "a loss to the Town of tax revenue." Mr. Arthur Boyle asked about the maintenance over the years, adding that the Town is "not even brush hogging." Mr. Dumian reiterated that the Highway Department has a maintenance schedule for Town roads. Mr. Dell Boyle questioned Mr. Coddington's comment about taxes, asking, "Is Brian paying for the road? For Boyle Boulevard?" Mr. Coddington replied that "CHIPs (Consolidated Highway Improvement Program) funds and tax money is paying for Boyle Boulevard," with "more people paying in for very few people on the road."

REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING <u>AUGUST 8, 2017</u>

SEWER STATION GRINDER PUMPS

Crew Leader Tom DeLamarter stated that the sewer station grinder pumps were delivered today, and added that the control panel will be delivered soon, and then the repairs can be made to Sewer Station 5.

CONKLIN POOL TO CLOSE FOR THE SEASON

Mr. DeLamarter reported that the Conklin Pool will close for the season, with August 27 being the last day it will be open.

TENNIS COURTS/ICE RINK

Mr. DeLamarter stated that he is getting quotes for the cost to resurface the basketball and handball courts at Schnurbusch Park. The question was raised whether to also resurface the tennis courts at Julius Rogers Park, or to move the tennis courts to Schnurbusch Park, along with the fencing, and install a berm. This would allow the Town to flood the tennis courts in the winter and create an ice rink, without the issues the Town has faced with the current ice rink's liner. Mr. DeLamarter was asked to get an estimate for this project, and when asked about lighting for the ice rink, he stated, "We can work that out."

LOCAL LAW 3, 2017/AMENDING CHAPTER 140 OF THE TOWN CODE/ "ZONING"

Ms. Sacco distributed a draft of proposed Local Law 3, 2017, "Amending Chapter 140 of the Town of Conklin Code Entitled 'Zoning'." The changes deal with signage regulations in the Town of Conklin. Ms. Sacco asked if the Board wants to send the proposed law on to the Planning Board for its recommendations or send it back to the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) for further review. Mr. Dumian stated that the Town Board is the governing body and that he feels it does not need to go back to the ZBA, but rather should be sent to the Planning Board. Ms. Sacco stated that she will send it to the Planning Board and submit the 239 Form for review.

RESO 2017-156: SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING/PROPOSED LOCAL LAW 3, 2017/AMENDING CHAPTER 140 OF TOWN CODE/ "ZONING"/ SEPTEMBER 26, 2017 AT 6:35 P.M.

Mr. Farley moved for the following resolution:

Be It Resolved: that the Town Board of the Town of Conklin schedules a Public Hearing at 6:35 P.M. on September 26, 2017, to receive input regarding proposed Local Law 3, 2017, "Amending Chapter 140 of the Town of Conklin Code Entitled 'Zoning'."

SHEEP GRAZING ON TOWN LANDFILL

Mr. Boyle asked for an update on Jerry Russell's proposal that he be allowed to graze sheep on the Town Landfill, which he had stated would save the Town time and money to mow the Landfill. Mr. Boyle asked if an overlay district would need to be created or changes made to the zoning to allow this to happen. He asked if the DEC had approved this proposal. Mr.

DeLamarter stated that Shumaker Engineering and Consulting, which oversees maintenance compliance at the Landfill, had no issue with the sheep being allowed to graze. Ms. Sacco stated that the Town would need a letter stating this fact. Mr. DeLamarter stated Shumaker Engineering and Consulting had specified that the liner cannot be punctured. Mr. Vascello stated that New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets requires that a shelter be provided for the sheep and asked if Mr. Russell planned on putting a tarp on part of the fence. He added that residents may also want to use sheep or goats to mow their personal properties, if the Town allows sheep to graze on the Landfill. Ms. Sacco asked if the Board wants her to prepare a draft local law for the September 12 meeting and Mr. Dumian stated, "No." Mr. DeLamarter stated, "I don't want them there. They will make a muddy mess. We can brush hog. Or Jerry (Russell) can."

SUMMER FUN PROGRAM

Mr. Dumian stated that the Summer Fun Program is "going really well," adding that there is a "good split" between children from the Towns of Conklin, Kirkwood, and Binghamton. He stated that the program will be held at the Bell Elementary School in Kirkwood in 2018, as Donnelly Elementary School will be undergoing a capital project renovation. Mr. Dumian stated that the counselors are doing "a phenomenal job." He stated that he sent letters to the Town of Kirkwood and Town of Binghamton Town Boards asking them to add money to their 2018 budgets to help fund the program next year. Mr. Dumian stated that the food program connected to the Summer Fun Program is also going very well.

DICK'S WAREHOUSE DISTRIBUTION CENTER EXPANSION (PHASE 2)

Mr. Dumian stated that he has heard various concerns expressed regarding the Dick's Warehouse Distribution Center Phase 2 Expansion project and impacts it might have on local flooding. He stated that Mr. Vascello had compiled a report for him regarding precipitation for 2017. He stated that the report stated that by August 2, 2017, 37.08 inches of precipitation (rain and melted snow) had been recorded at the Broome County Airport. In comparison, by July 26, 2016, only 16.9 inches had been recorded, and only 36.11 inches for the entire year of 2016. Mr. Dumian stated that weather experts have stated that 2017 is the "wettest year on record," which accounts for the oversaturation of the ground and the increase in standing ground water. Mr. Dumian stated that this indicates that the change in topography at the Dick's site is not responsible for the increased ground water and ground saturation levels. He stated that the Dick's Warehouse project will bring more jobs to our area, noting that local businesses are already experiencing an increase in activity due to the construction crew working on the site. Mr. Dumian called the Dick's Warehouse project a "great project."

There being no other business to come before the Board, Mr. Farley moved for adjournment, seconded by Mr. Francisco. The meeting adjourned at 8:15 P.M.
