HAPPY THANKSGIVING

Mr. Boyle wished everyone a Happy and safe Thanksgiving.

TRAINS BLOCKING RAILROAD TRACKS

Mr. Farley stated that he spoke to the Superintendent of the railroad company regarding the trains blocking crossings at Terrace Drive, Shaw Road, and Powers Road, expressing concern that emergency vehicles would have to travel around the blocked crossings to the northern or southern ends of the Town, losing precious time in an emergency. He was told that trains leave the station between 8 and 9 A.M. and between 7 and 8 P.M. The railroad Superintendent stated that trains are now 9,000 feet long, with no limit imposed on the length of the trains, so they take longer to pass through the crossings. Mr. Farley stated that the Fire Department has a contact phone number for the railroad so that a train could be cut if absolutely necessary, although it was noted that it may be just as fast to drive around the crossings. Mr. Farley stated that the Town of Conklin has no authority over the railroad company.

DUGOUTS AT SCHNURBUSCH PARK

Mr. Platt stated that the new dugouts at Schnurbusch Park "look great."

PIPE UNDER ROAD AT CONKLIN FORKS ROAD & CONKLIN ROAD INTERSECTION

Mr. Platt asked if there is any news from New York State regarding replacing the pipe under the road at the intersection of Conklin Forks Road and Conklin Road, as the area floods every time there is a heavy rain. Mr. Boyle stated that there is currently a freeze on projects at the State level.

CANCELLATION OF COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT

Mr. Dumian stated that he is working on the closeout with GOSR (Governor's Office for Storm Recovery) of the cancellation of the Community Center/Wellness Center project.

Mr. Dumian stated that the Town has a good budget for 2021 and wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Francisco moved for adjournment, seconded by Mr. Platt. The meeting adjourned at 7:00 P.M.
